We have also joined the Commissioner's College with a new College of Boy Scouting program to form a Tri-Council University of Scouting.

Commissioners, Boy Scout Leaders & Roundtable Staff are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity to learn about Scouting and the importance of their roles to the health of Scouting units. The wide variety of courses offered provide the training necessary to enhance the capabilities of the participants to meet the needs of the units they serve.

### Bachelor of Roundtable Science

This is our inaugural effort to expand the program to include Roundtable staff. The program is intended to improve service to the units at district Roundtables. There are no pre-requisites for this degree.

### Bachelor of Commissioner Science

Upon completing Commissioner Basic Training, this is the first level of Commissioner College focusing on improving unit service. (For Unit Commissioners or others who have not previously attended College).

### Master of Commissioner Science

This course focuses on continuing your education in learning how to better serve units. It will provide tools and techniques necessary to provide "Lifesaving" methods. There are also courses intended for District or Assistant District and Roundtable Commissioners geared toward learning more about the administrative methods needed to excel as commissioner.

### Doctor of Commissioner Science

The final step in completing the traditional commissioner coursework. Sessions will assist the commissioners in writing their Thesis.



### Continuing Advanced Training

Intended for Roundtable Commissioners and their staff to provide increased knowledge in providing better roundtables.

## Degree Requirements

### BACHELOR'S DEGREE

*Prerequisites* - Commissioner candidates must be registered as a Commissioner and it is preferred (but not required) that they complete Commissioner Basic Training prior to this College. College of Boy Scouting candidates should complete "Fast Start" and "This is Scouting" on-line courses offered through the BSA website. There are no prerequisites for the Bachelor of Roundtable Science.

*Requirements* - (Commissioners Only) Completion of seven courses of instruction, at least five at the bachelor's program level Earning the Commissioner's Key with the Arrowhead Honor will receive college level entrance equivalency credit for BCS101, BCS 102, BCS 103, BCS 104, BCS 105, BCS 106 and BCS 116 resulting in a BCS Degree. It is possible to complete and receive a BCS at one College.

### MASTER'S DEGREE

*Prerequisites* - Completion of bachelor's degree - or - BCS equivalency by having been awarded the Commissioner's Key, Earned Arrowhead Honor, & Registered Commissioner.

*Requirements* - Completion of seven additional courses of instruction not used to qualify for other college awards (total of 14 which may include the 7 BCS level equivalencies), at least seven of the courses at the master's program level. With a BCS it is possible to complete and receive a BCS at one College.

### DOCTOR'S DEGREE

*Prerequisites* - Completion of master's degree, Current registration as a commissioner.

*Requirements* - Completion of a thesis or research project on any topic of value to Scouting in the local council. The dean of the doctor's program or the staff adviser must approve the topic and final paper or project. Serve or have served as a commissioner for a minimum of 5 years. Serve or have served on the CCS faculty (instructor or support staff) for a least one-year. Recruit or have recruited at least three new commissioners. Completion of 10 additional courses of instruction not used to qualify for other college awards (total of 24 which may include the 7 BCS and 7 MCS level equivalencies).

**Bachelor of Commissioner Science** - Courses include Introduction to Commissioner Science, Unit Charter Renewal, Commissioner and the District, Unit Visitation 2.0, Commissioner Priorities, Service to New Units, Commissioner/Professional Relationships,

**Bachelor of Roundtable Science** - Courses include Roundtable Planning, Roundtable Staff Management, Program Feature Presentation, Effective Roundtables I, Making Fun Cub Scout Roundtables, Cub Scout Program Planning & Boy Scout Program Planning.

**Master of Commissioner Science Track "A"** - Courses include No-lapse/No-drop Units, Unit Finance, Commissioner Lifesaving I, Commissioner Lifesaving II, Counseling Skills, Solving Unit Problems & Journey to Excellence - The Commissioner's Role.

**Master of Commissioner Science Track "B"** - Courses include Just for Assistant District Commissioners, Recruiting New Commissioners, Orienting and Training Commissioners, Unit Service in Low-income Urban Areas, Unit Service in Remote Rural Areas, The Commissioner's Top 10 List & District Support for Commissioners.

**Doctor of Commissioner Science** - Courses include Selecting Thesis / Research Project Topic, Limiting the Scope of the Topic, Developing Thesis Outline and Writing Report, Thesis Workshop: Refining Topic or Project, Thesis Workshop: Beginning the Work, Assessing Council & District Health & Commissioner and Professional: A Working Relationship.

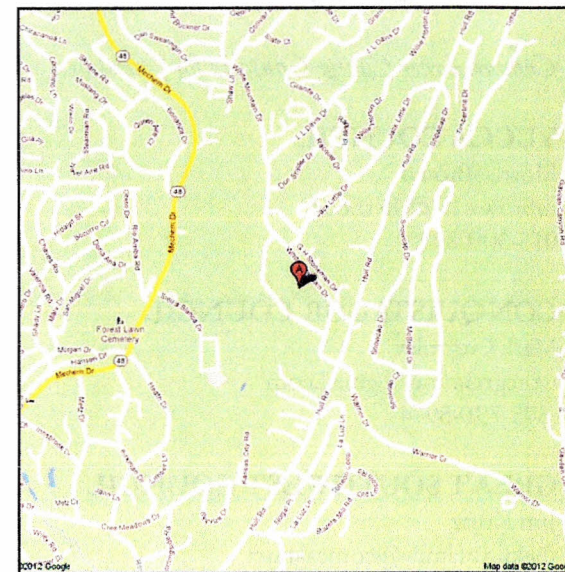
